

# Odometer Adjustment Declaration

Odometer tampering is a criminal offence and occurs where an odometer reading is adjusted to be lower than the actual kilometres travelled. This is a mechanical safety issue for an unsuspecting driver or purchaser of a car and is also illegal under the Australian Consumer Law (ACL) and *Motor Vehicle Dealers Act 1973* (WA), resulting in a maximum \$50,000 fine. This declaration allows dealers and repairers to adjust the odometer to the most accurate reading against wear and tear of the car, provides proof of the change and notes the steps taken to verify the accurate odometer reading.
