

Application for exemption from continuing professional development for recognition of alternative learning

This request can only be made during a CPD year (between 1 April - 31 March) for which this application relates

A regulated person can apply for an exemption from completing continuing professional development (CPD) activities on a pro-rata basis if you have completed:

- a module from the Diploma of Property Services (Agency Management) CPP50307 as a learning opportunity; or
- CPD in another state or territory of Australia where the applicant holds an equivalent licence in that state or territory.

The Commissioner for Consumer Protection (the Commissioner) may approve an exemption where the activity meets the requirements of the CPD program.

You will need to:

- provide sufficient evidence to show the training is relevant to WA CPD activities; and
- apply one point per hour of equivalent CPD up to a maximum of five points.

You must include:

- evidence of attendance at the training activity;
- a copy of the certificate along with details of any CPD activities completed for an equivalent interstate licence, e.g. agenda topics subjects, how many hours the course was for and how many CPD points you earned;
- a schedule of the training which must include subject matter and times; and
- evidence of any assessment undertaken and passed (if relevant).

The maximum of five CPD points may be credited for the training or study per year.
